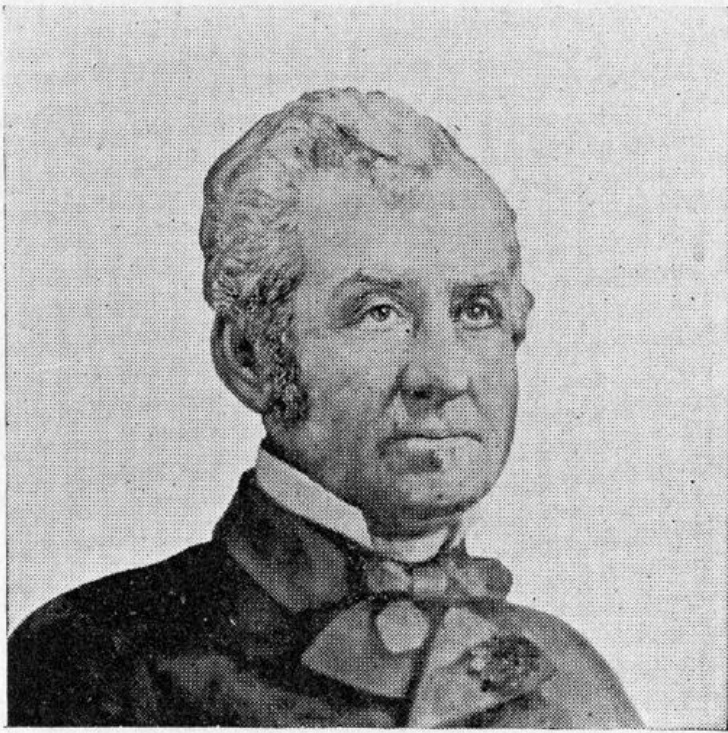

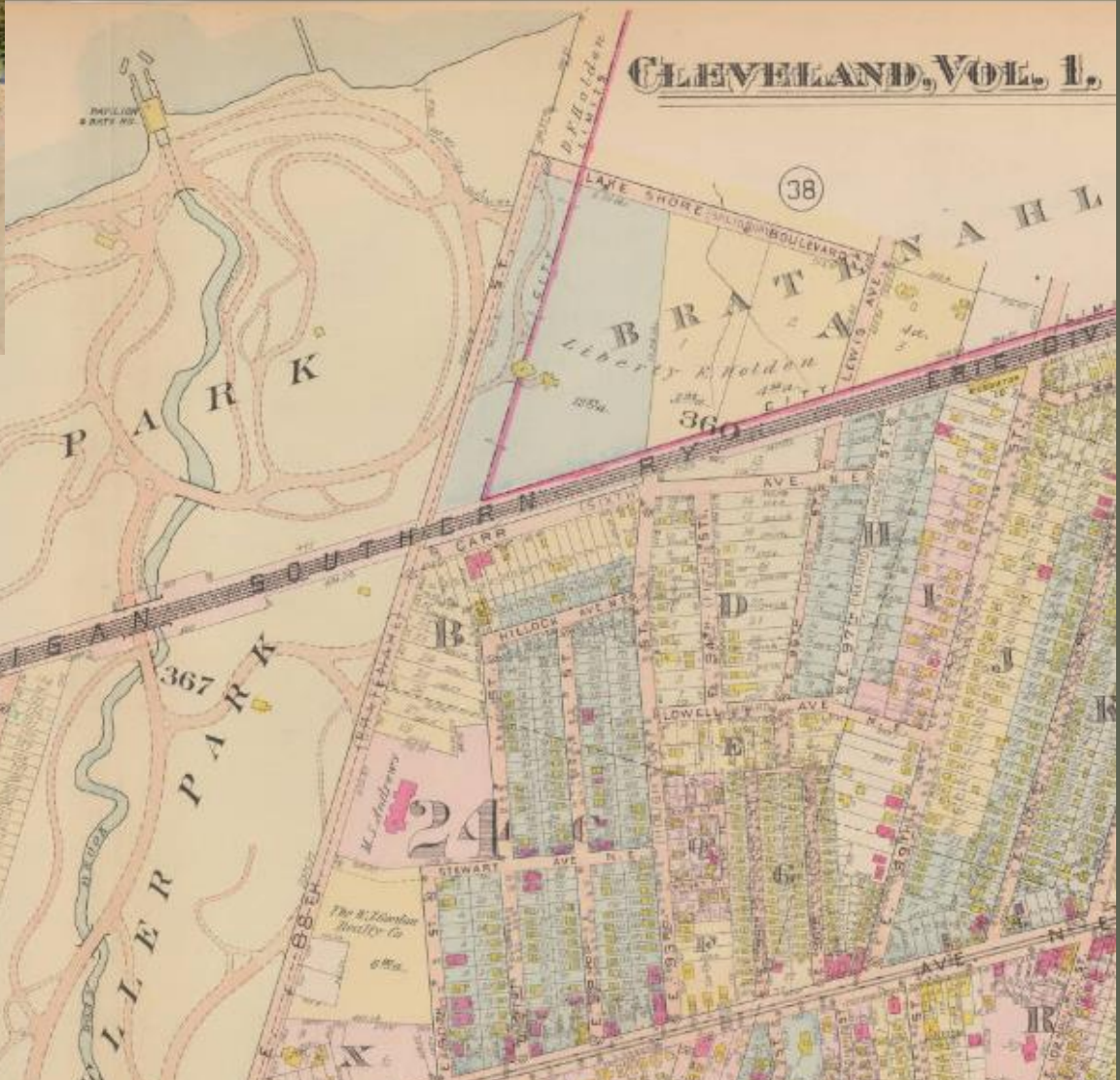


THE BRIG COLUMBIA, WHICH CARRIED THE FIRST CARGO OF ORE THROUGH THE

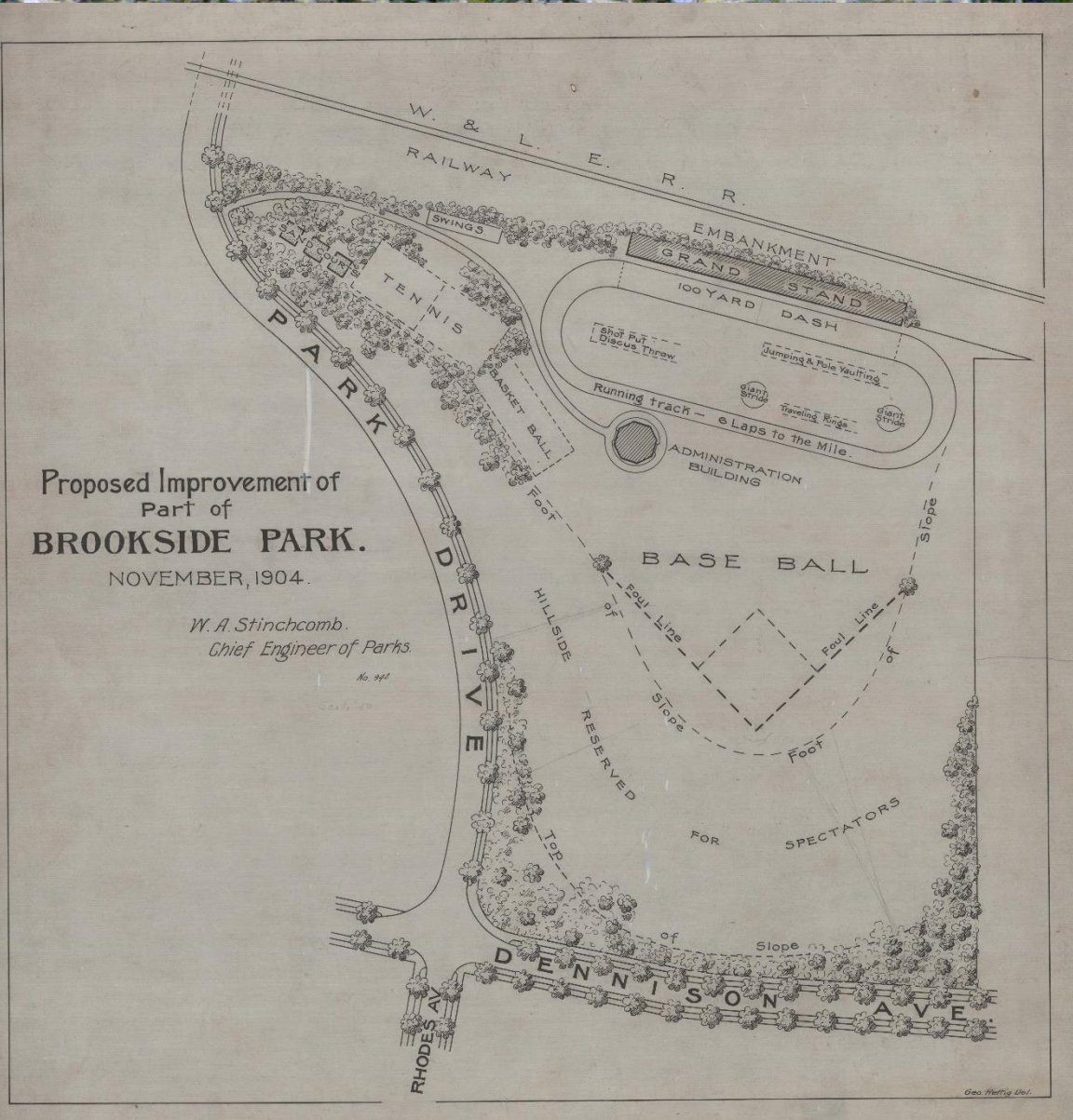

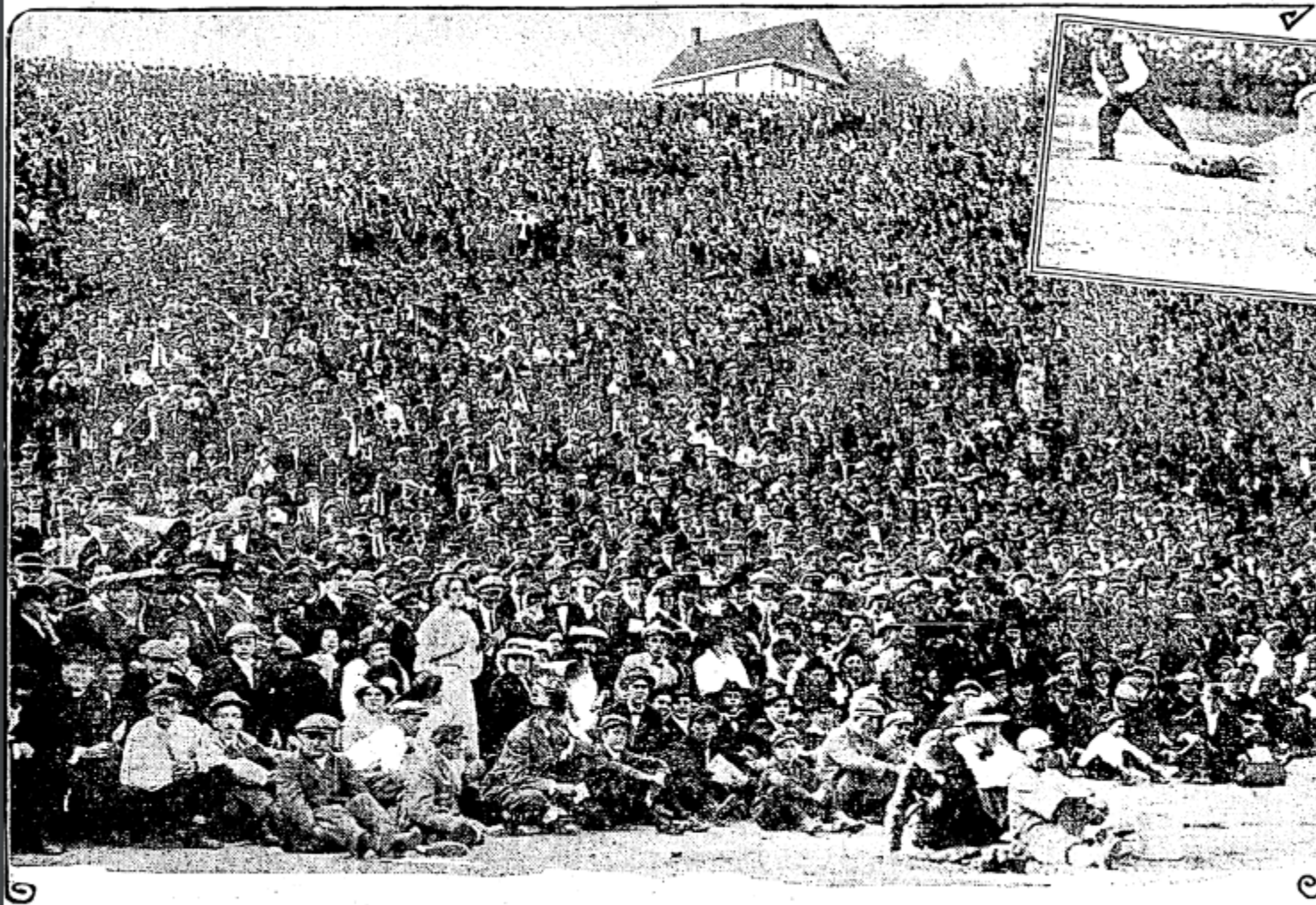

## BROOKSIDE STADIUM FEATURES

Steve Killeen, umpire-in-chief who gave such general satisfaction with his decisions behind the plate, labored under a big handicap. Two badly bruised arms, a split ear and a pair of damaged ribs were among his ailments.

No! Steve was not in a fight. He merely officiated in a Sixth city league game in the morning and succeeded in stopping nearly as many balls as the two catchers combined. On one occasion he received a crack on the arm and had to take out about four minutes to rub the injured member. On the first ball pitched after he had resumed his position the other arm was put out of commission.

Danny White slipped up on an easy out in the third inning. With Kirby on first, Verran whipped the ball over in an effort to catch the shortstop off the bag. Kirby overdid the sack, however, and White, thinking his man safe, failed to put the ball on him.

Saxe will hardly admit it of course, but it looked very much as if the Street Cleaners had the big dreamer's goat in the first and sixth innings. City ball players took advantage of every little opportunity to tell Saxe the sort of a pitcher they thought he was—and the way the twirler was answering back showed quite plainly that he was worried.

Anyone taking a look at the stadium after the game might well imagine that it was January instead of September. Most of the people took newspapers with them to sit on. The sheets, strewn

about after the game, gave the field the appearance of being covered with snow.

Roy Kirby looked like a world beater during the early part of the game. His first time up he sacrificed, his next effort being a sharp single to center, thus making his fourth hit in four times up in the series. On his last two trips to the plate, however, he struck out, some of his wallops at Verran's drops being way wide of the mark.

Danny White stretched too high for a throw at first in the fifth inning and annexed a stitch in his side. The aid of players from both teams, a few trainers, coaches, backers, policemen (mounted and otherwise) and spectators, however, soon brought Danny around.

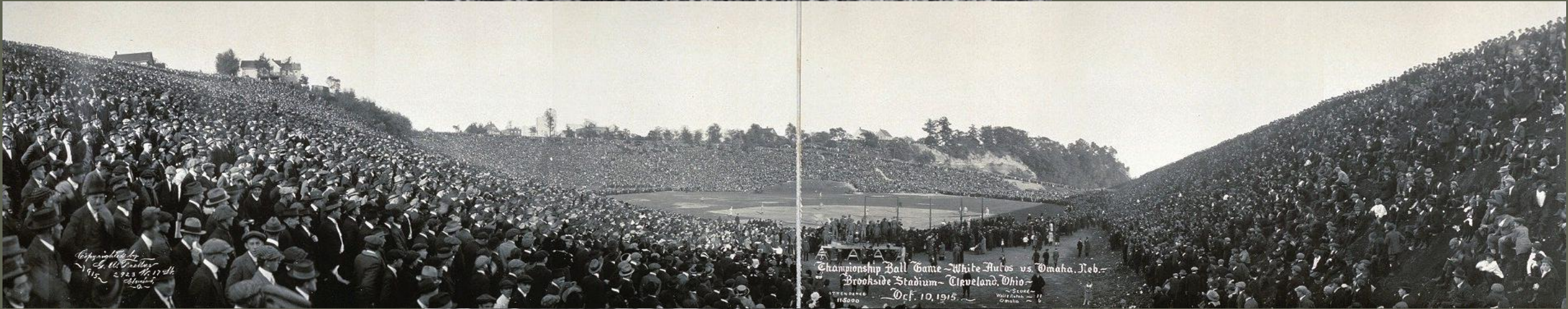
Gohr was guilty of a technical base in the eighth inning. With first and

second occupied, Murphy tapped one in front of the plate that bounded directly into the catcher's hands. With an easy force play at third in sight, Gohr lost his sense of direction and chipped the ball to second. Young made the play complete by dropping the throw, all hands thus being safe.

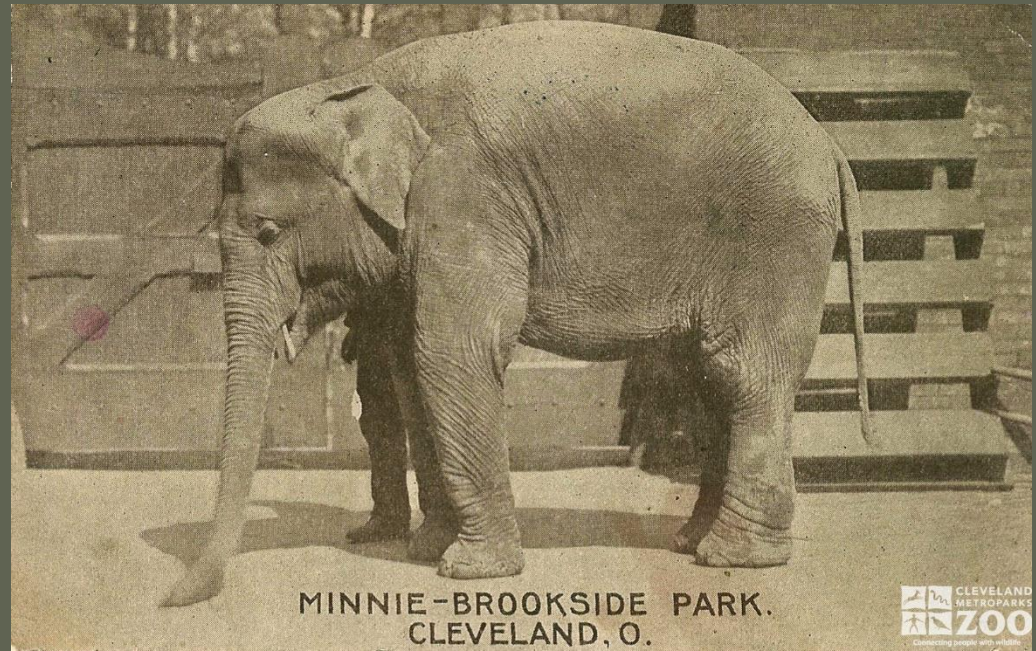
McGrail's double scored two of his teammates in the sixth, but the heavy hitting outfielder fumbled in a pinch in the eighth. With the bases full the crowd pulled for him to sanctify his home run drive of the week before. Mac had to be content, however, with watching the third strike beat by.

Verran got a big hand when he stepped to bat in the eighth. The youngster had pitched a great game and made one hit in addition. He responded to the applause a-la-la-lajoie, a line single to center.

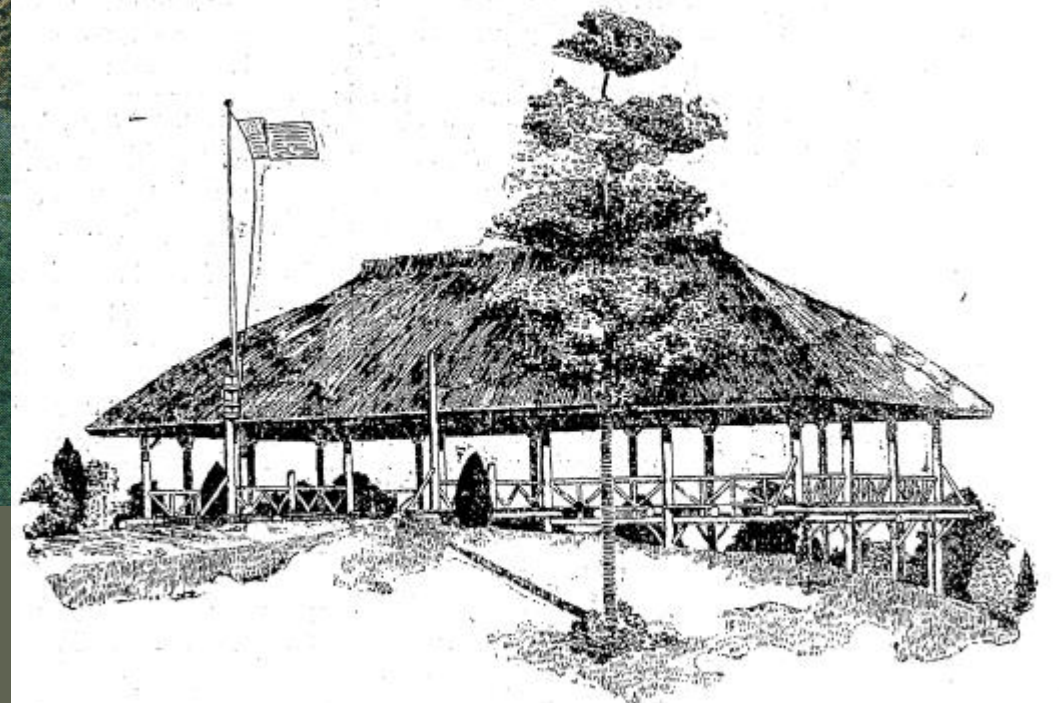

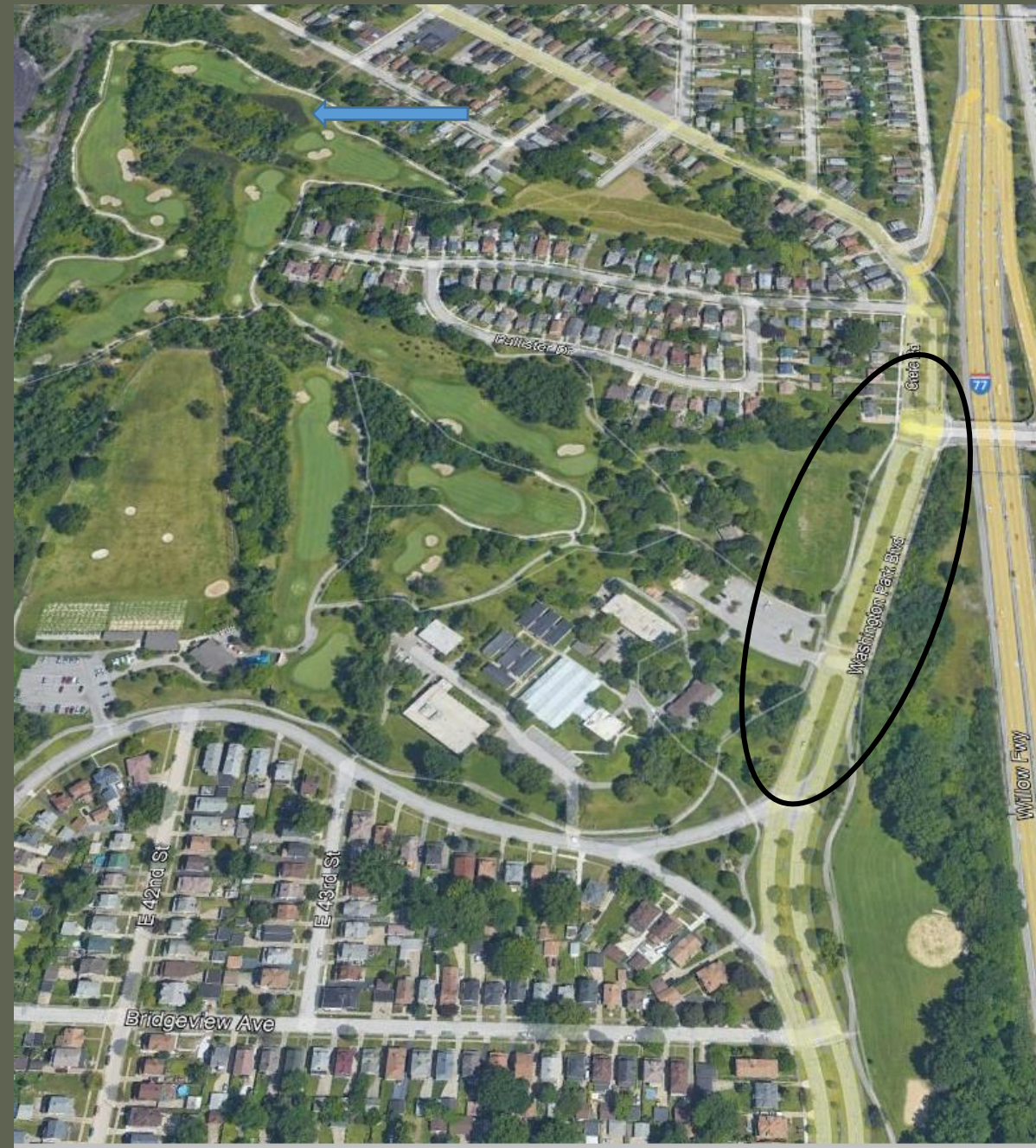
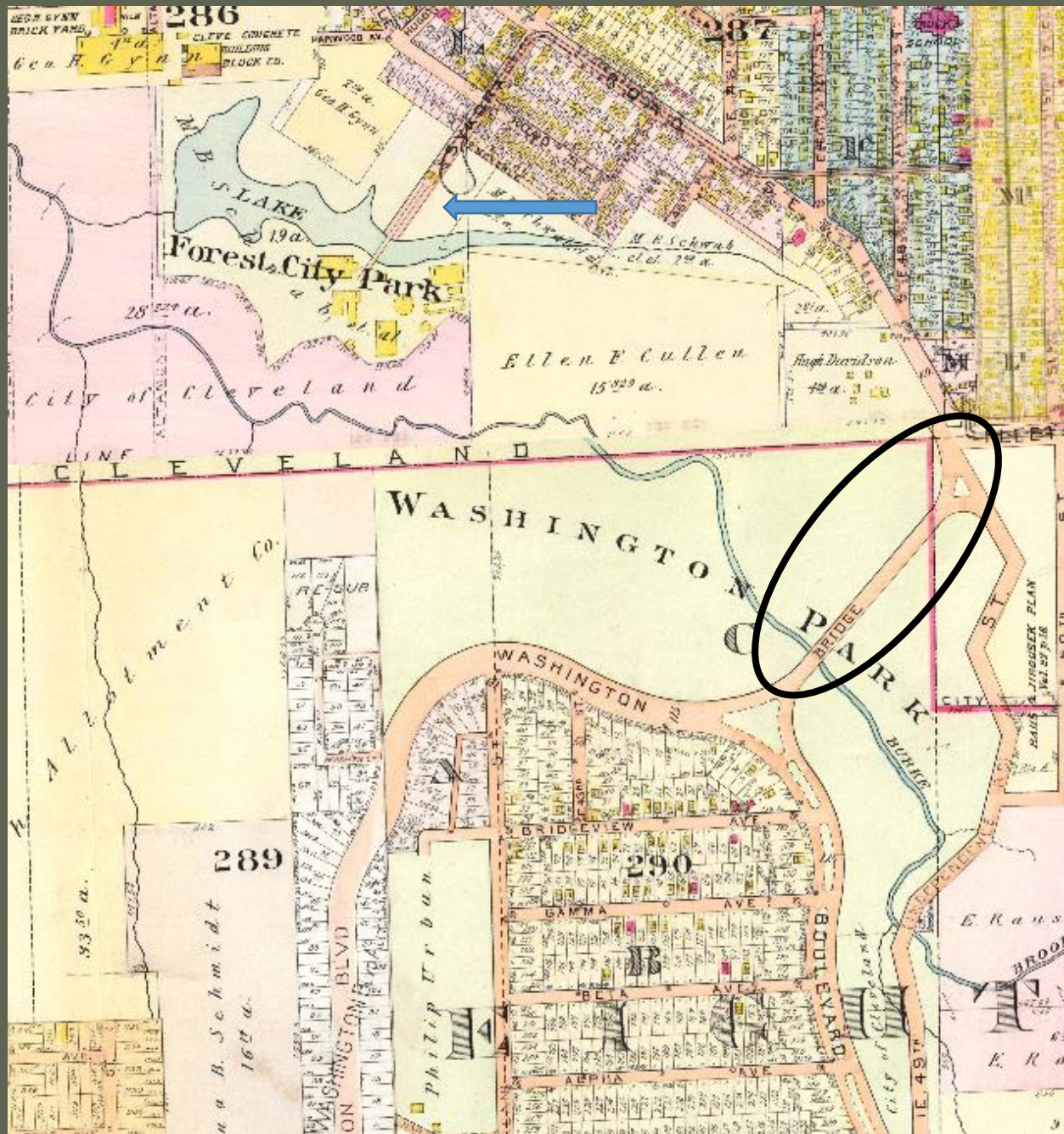
